Psychology Transfer Pathway (AA to BA)

for Ohio Community College students transferring to Malone University



November 2022

This document outlines the Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway (OGTP) in Psychology that has been designed to provide clarity and consistency for college courses transferring between Ohio 2-year and 4-year public institutions.

This same transfer pathway in Psychology is now approved for students transferring to Malone University, through a partnership between 11 Ohio community colleges and 14 private colleges called the Ohio Consortium for Transfer Pathways to the Liberal Arts, and whose faculty and administration have collaborated to expand access and credit clarity for students transferring with an associate's degree from an Ohio community college to an Ohio private college or university.

Pages 1 & 2 of this document outline **community college courses that are approved statewide** for transfer credit for the AA tp BA degree in psychology at an approved 4-year institution. Pages 3-4 show the AS to BS degree. Pages 5-7 show how these courses transfer to Malone University to meet bachelor degree requirements.

How Psychology Pathway Courses Transfer to Malone University



A student transferring to Malone University with the associate of arts degree and psychology transfer pathway completed will receive maximum credit, placing them at or near junior standing with introductory coursework in the psychology major completed. Most of the Malone University general education requirements can be completed as part of the associate degree, through planning with a transfer advisor. Students interested in transferring to Malone University should meet with an admission counselor regarding optimal course selection and admission requirements.

The following table outlines how transfer credits from the psychology transfer pathway and associate's degree will be applied to the Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Science in Psychology degree at Malone University.

At Malone University, Abnormal Psychology or Psychology of Personality transfers as the "Pre-Clinical" Menu option. If the other is taken in addition, then it will transfer as a free elective. Social Psychology transfers as the Soc/Cultural Menu option. Developmental courses that focus on particular ages generally transfer as the Menu option for the age group: either Infant-Adulthood Menu or Adulthood-Aging Menu.

Advising Notes:

The RESCRCH & PSYCCV menu requirements are designed to help a student explore their calling and gain vocational insights through experiential learning. *In regard to PSYC272/273, a substitution may be made with PSYC274. PSYC420/430 may be replaced with an equivalent internship. PSYC410&480 may be replaced with an equivalent/ combined Christianity & Psychology course.

Malone University requires a student to take one from each of the focused developmental menus: PSYCEDV (Infant-Adulthood) AND PSYCAA (Adulthood-Aging). Typically, a student with the AA degree will have Lifespan Development which transfers as PSYC220: Human Development and one other developmental course, which typically transfers to satisfy either the PSYCEDV or the PSYCAA menurequirement.
