Psychology Transfer Pathway (AA to BA)

for Ohio Community College students transferring to Tiffin University





This document outlines the <u>Ohio Guaranteed Transfer Pathway (OGTP) in Psychology</u> that has been designed to provide clarity and consistency for college courses transferring between Ohio 2-year and 4-year public institutions.

This same transfer pathway in Psychology is now approved for students transferring to Tiffin University, through a partnership between 11 Ohio community colleges and 14 private colleges called the <u>Ohio Consortium for Transfer Pathways to the Liberal</u> <u>Arts</u>, and whose faculty and administration have collaborated to expand access and credit clarity for students transferring with an associate's degree from an Ohio community college to an Ohio private college or university.

Pages 1 & 2 of this document outline **community college courses that are approved statewide** for transfer credit for the AA to BA degree in psychology at an approved 4-year institution. Pages 3-4 show the AS to BS degree. Pages 5-16 show how these courses transfer to Tiffin University to meet bachelor degree requirements.

Ohio Consortium for Transfer Pathways to the Liberal Arts How Psychology Pathway Courses Transfer to **Tiffin University**

A student transferring to Tiffin University with the psychology transfer pathway and associate's degree completed will receive maximum transfer credit, placing them at or near junior standing. Most or all of the Tiffin University general education requirements and introductory major courses can be completed as part of the associate degree, through planning with a transfer advisor. Students interested in transferring to Tiffin University should meet with an admission counselor regarding optimal course selection and admission requirements.

The following tables outline how transfer credits from the psychology transfer pathway and associate's degree will be applied to the bachelor's degree at Tiffin University, with majors in Psychology with Concentrations in Human Services, Addictions Counseling, Cross Cultural and International Psychology, Sport Psychology, and Online Psychology.

Advising Notes:

COM 130 Introduction to Speech Communication is a TU requirement-if a student comes in with a comparable course, it would count as OT 36 approved humanities/electives, thus it's not included in the sample plan. For online programs, two seven-week terms are offered every semester. Because online learning involves a lot of time-intensive individual self-study, in a short seven-week term students are limited to two classes per term unless permission is granted. With accelerated coursework it's not recommended to take more than 13 hours online in a semester. If a student wanted to complete their degree sooner, they could seek permission to take another course each semester and/or they could take a couple of courses in the summer. It is recommended that open electives be used to take PSY, SOC, FOR, COR courses, depending on the student's career goals, to bolster the psychology major.
